(CIVIL ENFORCEMENT AREA)

ORDER 2013

The Reading Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32, 35, 45, 46, 39 and 53 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act of 1984"), as amended and of all other powers thereunto enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 and in accordance with Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the Act of 2004"), hereby make the following Order:-

PART I

CITATION AND INTERPRETATION

1. This Order may be cited as The Borough of Reading (Pay and Display) (Civil Enforcement Area) Order 2013 and shall come into operation on the 30 September 2013.

2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-

"ambulance" has the same meaning as in the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;

"authorised agent" means the parking services contractor appointed by and acting on behalf of the Council for the purposes of the supervision and enforcement of this Order;

"authorised cab rank" means an area of carriageway which is comprised within and indicated by road markings complying with diagram 1028.2 in Schedule 6 to the 2002 Regulations;

"authorised officer" means the Head of Transport for the Council or any other officer to be designated by the Council;

"authorised parking place" means any parking place on a road, authorised or designated by this Order;

"bus" has the same meaning as in Regulation 22 of the 2002 Regulations;

"bus stand" means any area of carriageway, intended for the waiting by buses, which is comprised within and indicated by road markings complying with diagram 1025.1 and incorporating the words "Bus Stand" in Schedule 6 and a sign complying with diagram 975 in Schedule 5 to the 2002 Regulations;

“bus stop clearway” means any area of carriageway intended for the waiting by buses, which is comprised within and indicated by road markings complying with diagram 1025.1 in Schedule 6 and a sign complying with diagram 974 in Schedule 5 to the 2002 Regulations;

“business permit” means a permit issued to a business occupying premises, the postal address of which is in a road or part of a road specified in Schedule 499 and issued under the provisions of Article 38;

“business permit holder” means a person to whom a business permit was issued under the provisions Article 38;

“carriageway” means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles;

“Civil Enforcement Officer” has the same meaning as in section 76 of the Act of 2004;

“disabled person’s badge”, “disabled person’s vehicle” and “parking disc” have the same meanings as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

“doctor” means a ‘fully registered person’ as defined in section 55 of the Medical Act 1983;

“driver”, in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place or on a road or length of road, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in that parking place or road or length of road;

“dual purpose vehicle” has the same meaning as in the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986, or any re-enactment or modification thereof from time to time.

“goods” means goods or burden of any description and includes postal packets of any description;

“delivering” and “collecting” in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

“goods vehicle” has the same meaning as in the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986, or any re-enactment or modification thereof from time to time in force;

“hackney carriage” means a vehicle licensed under Section 37 of the Town Police Causes Act 1847, Section 6 of the Metropolitan Carriages Act 1869, or any similar enactment;

“immobilisation device” has the same meaning as in Section 104(9) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

“invalid carriages” has the same meaning as in the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986, or any re-enactment or modification thereof from time to time.

"loading" means the loading or unloading of goods to or from a vehicle;

"motorcycle" and "motor tricycles" has the same meaning as in the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986, or any re-enactment or modification thereof from time to time;

"owner", in relation to a vehicle, has the same meaning as in Section 92(1) of the Act of 2004 or the person who has the use of such a vehicle in the course of his/her employment and is entitled to use such a vehicle as though he/she were the registered keeper thereof;

"parking place" has the same meaning given by section 79(7) of the Act of 2004;

"parking ticket" means a voucher issued as a paper slip, purchased from a relevant parking meter, indicating that its holder has paid for parking at a pay and display parking place as designated by this Order and subject to the limitations as prescribed by this Order;

"passenger vehicle" means a vehicle constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of their driver and not drawing a trailer;

"penalty charge" has the same meaning as in section 92(1) of the Act of 2004;

"penalty charge notice" has the same meaning as in section 8(1) of The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007;

"permit" means a permit issued under the provisions of Articles 34, 37, 38 and 39;

"permit holder" means a person to whom a permit has been issued;

"permitted hours" means 24 hours Monday to Sunday unless otherwise specified by Schedules 603, 606, 607 and 608;

"relevant position" in respect of:-

- (a) a parking permit, means
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, that the badge or permit is exhibited thereon with the front facing forward on the kerbside of and immediately behind the windscreen; or
 - (ii) the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, that the badge or permit is exhibited on the front or kerbside of the vehicle;
- (b) a disabled person's badge, in accordance with Section 12 of The disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"resident" means a person whose usual place of abode is at premises the postal address of which is in a road or part of a road specified in Schedule 499;

"specified class" means the class of vehicles permitted to use the on street parking places as authorised by the Articles falling within Part IV of this Order;

"specified position" a vehicle left in a parking place during the permitted hours in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall cause it so to stand so that every part of a vehicle is within the limits of a parking place.

"specified hours" means the hours shown at the commencement of a Schedule containing parking or unloading places;

"telecommunication system" has the same meaning as in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

"The 2002 Regulations" means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002;

"traffic sign" has the same meaning as in section 92(1) of the Act of 2004.

3. The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any Regulations or Orders made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.
4. Save where the contrary is indicated, any reference in this Order to:-
 - (a) a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order;
 - (b) this Order or another Order shall be construed as such a reference to this Order or, as the case may be, such other Order, as the same may have been or may from time to time be amended, varied or supplemented;
 - (c) a Statute or Regulation shall be construed as reference to such Statute or Regulations as the same may have been, or may from time to time be amended or re-enacted.
 - (d) The requirements of any Article making reference to a numbered Schedule to this Order shall only have effect when a Schedule similarly numbered is appended to this Order.

PART II
AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

5. (1) The lengths of roads specified in Schedules 603, 606, 607, 608 and 609 are authorised to be used as pay and display on street parking places for the parking during the permitted hours and in such a position, as detailed in the Schedules provided the driver, owner or passenger of the vehicle has paid the charges as specified in the said Schedules AND
- (a) for vehicles to wait in relation to Schedule 603 between 8.00am and 8.00pm on Mondays to Sundays inclusive for a period of 2 hours excepting if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road;
 - (b) for vehicles to wait in relation to Schedule 606 between 10.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays Inclusive for a period of 2 hours excepting if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road;
 - (c) for vehicles to wait in relation to Schedule 607 between the hours of 8.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive for a period of 3 hours excepting if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road;
 - (d) for vehicles to wait in relation to Schedule 608 between the hours of 10.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive for a period of 3 hours excepting if a period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road;
 - (e) for vehicles to wait in relation to Schedule 609 between the hours of 8.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. on Mondays to Sundays inclusive for a period of 2 hours excepting if a previous period of less than 2 hours has elapsed since the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road;
- (2) The lengths of roads specified in Schedules 606 and 608, are authorised to be used as parking places for the parking during the permitted hours and in such positions as are specified in the said Schedules, of a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a valid Residents Parking Permit issued by the Council;
- (3) The lengths of road specified in Schedule 609 are authorised to be used by Hackney Carriages as a Hackney Carriage rank between the hours of 8.00 p.m. to 8.00 a.m. Monday to Sunday inclusive.

6. Where in the Schedules a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specific class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the parking place unless it:-
 - (a) is of the specified class; or as the case may be -
 - (b) is in the specified position;
 - (c) displays a valid parking permit issued by the Council.
7. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place:-
 - (a) so as to unreasonably prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by any other person, or so as to be a nuisance;
 - (b) when a Police Constable in uniform, Civil Enforcement Officer or a person authorised by the Council has closed the parking place.
8. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in, or to depart from, that parking place.
9. No person shall use a vehicle whilst it is in a parking place in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place, or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
10. When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Articles 6(b), a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer or a person authorised by the Council to do so may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position shall comply with that provision.
11. Any person altering the position of a vehicle by virtue of Articles 10 or 12 may do so in such manner as he thinks necessary.
12. A Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer or a person authorised by the Council to do so may, in case of emergency, or in contravention of Article 7, remove or cause to be removed to any place he thinks fit any vehicle left in a parking place.
13. Any person removing or causing to be removed a vehicle from a parking place in accordance with Article 12 shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

PART III
ON STREET PARKING PLACES PAY AND DISPLAY

14. The Council may:-
 - a. install, in such position or in the vicinity of a Pay and Display Parking Place as it may think fit, such ticket machines as are required by this Order for the purposes of that Pay and Display Parking Place; and
 - b. carry out such other work as is authorised by this Order or is reasonably required for the purpose of that Pay and Display Parking Place.

15. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be left in an on street parking place as authorised by Article 5, unless it is one of the following specified class of vehicles:
 - a. disabled persons vehicle,
 - b. dual purpose vehicle,
 - c. goods vehicle being less then 3.5 tonnes,
 - d. invalid carriage,
 - e. motor cycles,
 - f. motor tricycles, or a;
 - g. passenger vehicle.

16. Any vehicle left in a Pay and Display Parking Place shall be positioned as specified in Schedules 603, 606, 607, 608 and 609.

17. No vehicle shall display a parking ticket which has been previously displayed on another vehicle.

18. The minimum parking charge payable shall be in all cases for a vehicle left during the charging hours in a parking place specified in Schedule(s) 603, 606, 607, 608 and 609 for a minimum period of 20 minutes waiting, which, subject to the provisions of Article 19, shall not exceed a maximum period of waiting of no longer than two hours.

19. No vehicle which has been taken away from a parking place after the minimum charge had been incurred shall, until the expiration of two hours from the time it was taken away, again be left in that placing place during the charging hours.

20. The minimum parking charge payable shall be payable, on leaving of the vehicle in a parking place specified in Schedules 603, 606, 607, 608 and 609 by the insertion in the ticket machine relating to the parking place in which the vehicle is left coins or other payment method as provided on site at the pay and display ticket machine. Where more coins than one are required, they shall be inserted in the ticket machine immediately one after the other.

21. Upon payment of the minimum charge for the vehicle, the driver thereof shall exhibit on that vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of Article 24, a parking ticket issued by a pay and display ticket machine.

22. The parking ticket must be purchased from a pay and display ticket machine at the locations, in relation to the street on which the parking place which is being used as provided by Schedule 602 to this Order.
23. The provisions of Articles 20 and 21 shall not apply where in relation to the lengths of roads as described by Schedules 606 and 608, where the driver is exempt from payment by the conditions of use of a permit.
24. The parking ticket referred to in Article 21 above shall be exhibited on the vehicle:-
- a) where the vehicle is fitted with a front glass windscreen extending across the vehicle to the near side facing forwards on the near side of the glass of such windscreen, behind the glass or
 - b) where the vehicle is not fitted with a front glass windscreen on the near side of the vehicle facing towards the near side of the road
- but in all cases so that the time shown on the ticket is clearly visible to a person standing at the kerbside of the vehicle.
25. Nothing in Articles 17 to 24 shall apply to a Disabled Persons Vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in accordance with Section 12 of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000.
26. Nothing in Articles 5 and 14 to 23 shall restrict the ability of the Council to close a parking place.
27. The provisions provide by Articles 7 to 13 of Part II of this Order shall apply to the pay and display on street parking places as authorised by Article 5 of this Order

PART IV **PERMITS**

28. (1) Any resident or doctor, who is the owner of a vehicle of the following class, that is to say a passenger vehicle, a goods vehicle, a invalid carriage or a motorcycle may apply to the Council or an authorised agent for a permit for the parking of that vehicle in a parking place specified in paragraph (5) of this Article and any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council or authorised agent and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied.
- (2) The Council or authorised agent may at any time require an applicant for a permit or a permit holder to produce to an officer of the Council or authorised agent such evidence in respect of an application for a permit as they may reasonably require to verify the particulars or information given to them or to verify that the permit is valid.

- (3) The Council or authorised agent upon being satisfied that the applicant is:-
 - (a) a resident who is the owner of a vehicle of the class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant a Residents Parking Permit for the leaving during the permitted hours in a parking place of the vehicle to which such permit relates, by the owner or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner (other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire and reward);
 - (b) a Doctor, who is the owner of a vehicle of the class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article, shall issue to the applicant 1 Doctors Parking Permit for the leaving at any time in the Doctors Parking Place specified thereon such vehicles as they are satisfied are used by fully registered persons who are liable to be called of necessity to emergencies away from the surgery or consulting room shown on the application to the extent that the need for special parking arrangements is justified and to whom no suitable alternative parking facility is available within a reasonable distance.
 - (4) A resident shall not be entitled to be in possession of more than one permit at any one occasion.
 - (5) a Residents Parking Permit shall only be a valid for use in a parking place specified in Schedules 606 and 608;
29. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in Article 28 the Council may also grant permits to such other persons as they may think fit.
30. (1) A permit holder (whether of a Residents or Doctors Parking Permit), may surrender such permit to the Council or authorised agent at any time and shall surrender such permit to the Council or authorised agent on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
- (2) The Council or authorised agent may, by notice in writing served on the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that person's residence, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Council or authorised agent that any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article has occurred and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council or authorised agent within 48 hours of the receipt of the aforementioned notice.
 - (3) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:-
 - (a) the permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
 - (b) the permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued;

- (c) the vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of the class specified in Article 28(1);
 - (d) the issue of a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 33;
 - (e) the expiry of the period for which the permit was issued;
 - (f) where a permit is issued to any person upon receipt of a cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured, the permit shall cease to be of any effect.
31. Without prejudice to the provisions of Article 30, a permit shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the period specified thereon:-
- (a) which period, in the case of a Residents or Doctors Permit, shall not exceed a period of twenty-three months from the end of the month during which it first became valid;
- or on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of Article 30, whichever is the earlier.
32. Upon receipt of an application pursuant to paragraph (1) of this Article and of the relevant permit, the Council or authorised agent may amend the permit accordingly, or to such extent as they think fit, or at their discretion issue a revised permit, and if a revised permit is so issued, the permit shall become invalid and shall be surrendered to the Council.
33. (1) If a permit is accidentally mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall surrender it to the Council or authorised agent and apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to him of a duplicate permit, whereupon Council or authorised agent, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the original permit shall become invalid.
- (2) If a permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Council or authorised agent for the issue to him of a duplicate permit and the Council or authorised agent upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the permit shall become invalid.
- (3) All the provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate permit to the same extent as they applied to the original permit.
34. A permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued;

- (b) the period during which, subject to the provisions of Article 28, the permit shall remain valid;
 - (c) an authentication that the permit has been issued by the Council;
 - (d) a code indicating the parking area for which the permit is valid.
35. At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place specified in Schedules 606 and 608 during the permitted hours, there shall be displayed in the relevant position a permit issued in respect of that vehicle valid for that parking place.
36. When a permit has been displayed in accordance with the provisions of Article 34, or where a penalty charge notice has been attached to the vehicle), no person other than a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer shall remove such permit or notice from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of that vehicle.
37. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, the Council may at its discretion issue a discretionary Notice allowing a specific vehicle to wait in a road or a parking place during the hours of operation of any restriction or prohibition to the contrary.

PART V
REVOCATIONS

38. The specified Schedules 600, 601, 603, and 606 contained within the following Order shall be revoked:
- a) Borough of Reading (Town Centre)(Civil Enforcement Area) (waiting Restrictions) Order 2013
 - b) Borough of Reading (Town Centre) (Pay and Display Limited Waiting Amendments) (Experimental) Order 2011
 - c) Borough of Reading (Town Centre) (ay and Display Limited Waiting) (Amendment) Order 2012
 - d) Town Centre and Surrounding Streets) (On Street Parking Places and Civil Enforcement Waiting Restrictions) Order 2010

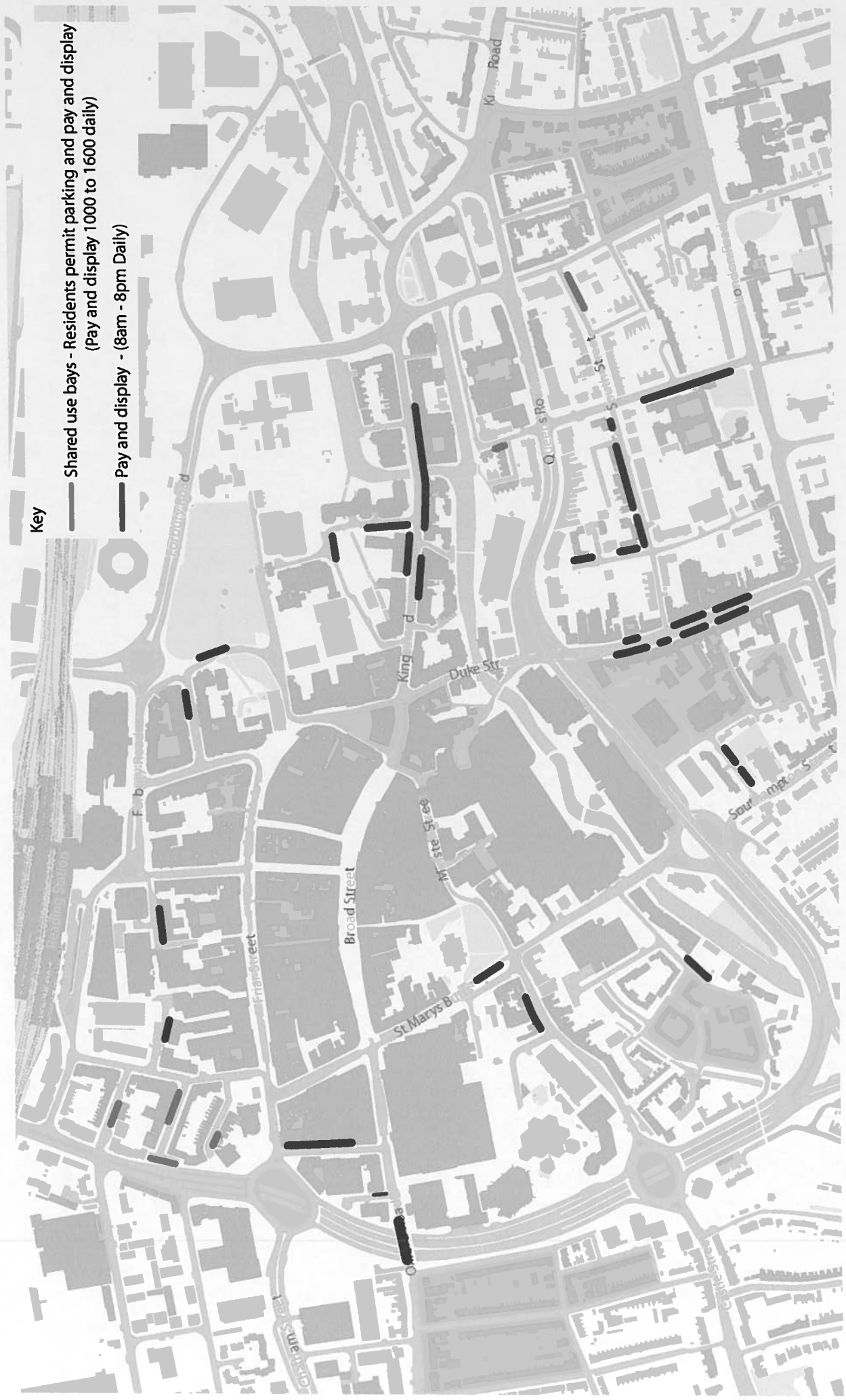

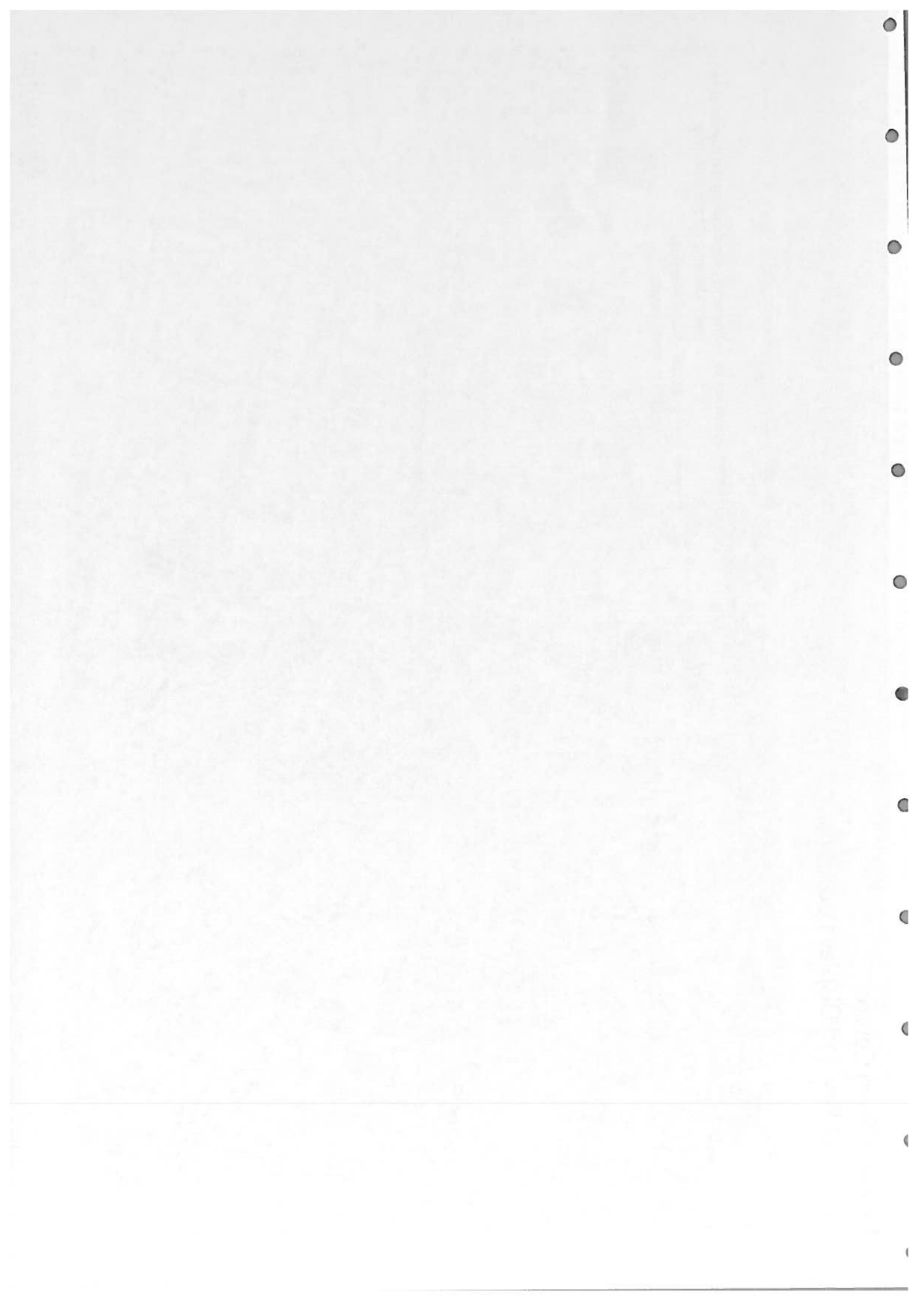
