

The Borough of Reading (Civil Enforcement Area) (Town Centre) (Red Route) Traffic Regulation Order 2020 Amendment No.2 202*

Reading Borough Council under Sections 1(1), 2, 2(1), 3, 4(2), 45 and 46, 122(1) and 122(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Schedule 9 to the Act as amended proposes to make the above Order.

The general nature and effect of the Order will be to amend The Borough of Reading (Civil Enforcement Area) (Town Centre) (Red Route) Traffic Regulation Order 2020 Amendment No.1 2020 as follows:

- delete Article 16(b) in its entirety and replace with the following clause:

any vehicle displaying a Disabled Persons Badge between the hours of 5.00am to 8.00pm only provided the Driver or owner of the vehicle remains for a maximum period of 4 hours only, no return within 2 hours Monday to Sunday on the lengths of roads as specified in Schedule 719.

- delete items 76 and 77 of Schedule 701 (no stopping at any time) and replace with the following:

Hosier St, both sides: From its junction with St Marys Butts to a point 20m west of that junction.

All objections and other representations to the proposed order must be made in writing and must specify the grounds on which they are made and must be sent to arrive before by no later than 12 February 2025. Objections received after this date may not be considered.

Please note that in accordance with the current Freedom of Information legislation, the Council may publish and/or disclose the entire content of any correspondence (including letter, forms or emails) sent in response to this Notice and such responses may be subject to public scrutiny.

As previously stated in press releases, any existing signs related to the above restrictions are not currently being enforced. The outcome of this consultation will be the sole determining factor in deciding whether these signs are retained or removed. The presence of current signage does not imply any predetermined outcome and all responses will be considered impartially to ensure a fair and unbiased decision making process.
